Step 2: Words Ending in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'

National Curriculum Objectives:

- Spell words with endings sounding like /ʒə/ or /tʃə/

Differentiation:

Questions 1, 4 and 7 (Application)

Developing Rewrite a sentence with the correct spelling of one easily decodable word that ends in either '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'.

Expected Rewrite a sentence with the correct spelling of two words that end in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Words are more difficult to decode (up to three syllable words).

Greater Depth Rewrite a sentence with the correct spelling of two words that end in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Some words from the Year 5/6 spelling list and other words that are more complex to decode and/or irregular.

Questions 2, 5 and 8 (Application)

Developing Write a single clause sentence including one word that ends in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Words are easily decodable (two syllable words). Word bank given.

Expected Write a multi-clause sentence including two words that end in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Words are more difficult to decode (up to three syllable words). Also includes at least two adjectives. Word bank given.

Greater Depth Write a multi-clause sentence including two words that end in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Some words from the Year 5/6 spelling list and other words that are more complex to decode and/or irregular. Also includes at least two adjectives and a preposition. Word bank given.

Questions 3, 6 and 9 (Reasoning)

Developing Explain an incorrect spelling of a word that ends in either '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Words are easily decodable (two syllable words).

Expected Explain an incorrect spelling of a word that ends in either '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Words are more difficult to decode (up to three syllable words).

Greater Depth Explain an incorrect spelling of a word that ends in either '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'. Some words from the Year 5/6 spelling list and other words that are more complex to decode and/or irregular.

Application and Reasoning Words Ending in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'

Developing

1a. Are you **sure** you want to go to see the match this Saturday?

2a. **Various answers, for example: The criminals wanted to capture their victim's dog and demand a ransom for its return.**

3a. **No, there is a spelling mistake. It should be 'puncture', not 'puncsure'.**

Expected

4a. This afternoon, I painted a **picture** of a small furry **creature** for my teacher, as meerkats are his favourite.

5a. **Various answers, for example: After the dastardly pirates' departure, the king realised that his precious treasure had been stolen and immediately gave chase.**

6a. **No, there is a spelling mistake. It should be 'furniture', not 'furnicher'.**

Greater Depth

7a. After the star striker, Helen 'Hat Trick' Johnson, had written her **signature** on the contract, her new club gave a press conference to the national media to gain maximum **exposure** for their fantastic deal.

8a. **Various answers, for example: It gave me no pleasure at all, to have to remeasure the classroom for the new carpet, as I had to crawl around underneath the tables, which was very uncomfortable.**

9a. **No, there are two spelling mistakes. It should be 'teacher's', not 'teature's' and 'composure', not 'compoture'.**

Application and Reasoning Words Ending in '-sure', '-ture' or '-cher'

Developing

1b. Always check that your cake **mixture** is free of lumps.

2b. **Various answers, for example: Our teacher enjoys joking with us, but he can also be serious when he has to be.**

3b. **No, there is a spelling mistake. It should be 'richer', not 'riture'.**

Expected

4b. Car drivers have to regularly check the air **pressure** in their tyres, as if it gets too low, they run the risk of getting a **puncture**.

5b. **Various answers, for example: The endangered rainforest creature, which belonged to the lizard family, needed a lot of moisture in the air to keep its delicate skin damp.**

6b. **No, there is a spelling mistake. It should be 'adventure', not 'advencher'.**

Greater Depth

7b. During the school holidays, I went swimming at the local **leisure** centre, but the **temperature** of the water was so cold that I could only stay in for a few minutes and then, with teeth chattering, I had to climb out.

8b. **Various answers, for example: I was extremely shocked at the recent disclosure from the company that makes flycatchers, as they contain chemicals that are harmful to humans.**

9b. **No, there are two spelling mistakes. It should be 'enclosure', not 'enclocher' and 'recaptured', not 'recapsured'.**
