Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

This project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about celebrations. Learning may focus on different types of celebrations that take place and who may celebrate them. It could look at how people celebrate different events differently in other parts of the world.

- **Country Celebrations** - How are birthdays celebrated around the world? Look at [this website](#) to find out information on the celebrations. Maybe there's a particular country you would like to find out about. Create fact files or information posters to show the similarities and differences between the celebrations.
- **Build a Brilliant Board Game**- Create a board game that focuses on celebrations. Is it going to be a game like Monopoly or Snakes and Ladders? Are players going to need dice? Cards? Characters? Once you've created the game, write a 'How to Play' guide too. Test out the game during a family game's night. What did everybody learn about different celebrations?
- **Party Game Fun**- Plan your ideal birthday party or celebration event such as a party for your family and friends who are all meeting up for the first time since lockdown. Who is going to be invited to the event? What food would they like to eat? How will the room be decorated? What entertainment will there be? Design some invitations, get creative making decorations and perhaps make some party food or a celebration cake!
- **Cherished Memories**- Look through old family photos of previous celebrations the family have taken part in. What can you remember about the event? Discuss why the family celebrates in this way. Do you have any family traditions? You could draw a detailed sketch of your favourite photograph from the day or write a recount about a favourite celebration you've been part of day. Talk to parents, grandparents and other family members about their memories of childhood birthdays and Christmases. What is the same and what is different to the birthdays and Christmases you've had?
- **Patron Saints and Saint Days**- There are four patron saints in the UK: St. George for England, St. Andrew for Scotland, St. Patrick for Northern Ireland, and St. David for Wales. Can you find out about each saint and why they are still celebrated in the UK? Look [here](#) for some help. Perhaps you could create a timeline of each saint's life, write a short information report on each saint or draw a storyboard of their life?
- **Be Artistic!** – Create some artwork that shows a celebration. Think about the colours you would use to show that it is a happy event, what people might be doing, what else you might include (decorations, fireworks etc). You can look [here](#) , [here](#) or [here](#) for some inspiration
