Class News

Class R In maths we have been focussing on time. We read The Very Hungry Caterpillar and mapped out things we do on different days during the week. We read Peace at Last and decided whether different activities were done during the day or at night by running to the 'night-side' of the classroom or the 'day-side'. We read What's the Time Mr Wolf and set the clocks to o'clock times. We finished with a sand timer race and gave our predictions of which sand timer would be the fastest! In topic we have been finding out about the planets in our solar system. We have looked at some non-fiction books to find some features of the different planet and recorded these in our writing books. We have created lots of planet artwork using different mediums. In RE, we found out about Holi and worked together as a class to make a very colourful piece of art.

Class 1 This week, Class 1 have been learning all about The Piece Hall and it's significance. In maths, Year 1 have been focusing on tens, ones, and partitioning numbers from 20-50, wow! In Year 2 we have been learning about equal groups -sharing and even started the two times table! Year 2 went to the HX7 multi-skills competition and were fantastic!

Class 2 What a busy week Class 2 have had this week! In maths we have continued with our fraction unit. Year 3 have been solving problems using fractions and scales and Year 4 have been converting mixed numbers to improper fractions. In English, we have read more of Varjak's Paw and thought about how the main character is feeling throughout the chapters. We have also been learning synonyms for different emotion words. In science, we investigated how instruments make high-pitched and low-pitched sounds. We then created a model of the different sound waves using different sized Slinkys. In PE, we continued our basketball unit and started playing a mini game with shooting and defending. A great week everyone, well done!

Class 3. Class 3 have worked hard this week in all of their lessons - we have been so impressed! In English, children have been writing a dialogue between two characters that could fit into our class book 'Rooftoppers'. They all did an excellent job of thinking how the conversation could move the plot on and give the reader hints to the personalities of the characters. We have been working hard on developing strong passes in netball and looking at how to intercept them as a form of defensive play. Science was wonderful this week to see all the children understand that light is a spectrum of colour. We mixed lights together to prove this and then split a beam of light into a rainbow in our classroom for us to walk through. Finally, we have planted our seeds as part of our new outdoor learning topic!
