## **Class News**

Class R Reception have had a super busy week! This week we have been investigating our senses of sound and touch. We started our week by creating different sounds on our muddy Monday adventure: we used twigs, pebbles and leaves to create a range of amazing sounds. Reception went on their first ever school trip on Tuesday to Eureka and had a blast! We explored all the different areas, looking and learning and answering lots of 'how' and 'why' questions. We continued the week by creating amazing patterns in maths and art. We focused on the artist Yayoi Kusama and created our own artwork focusing on patterns and circles. Reception have been working really hard on their number recognition too. Great!

**Class 1** In geography this week we have been learning about the animals that live in Kenya. We have found out why animals migrate and learned more about The Big Five. In science our focus was how to keep our body healthy. We carried out an experiment to find out the effect of different exercises on our heart. In RE we learned how Sikhs make good choices and discussed the great work that Sikhs do for their community in the langar. In maths we are continuing to develop our addition skills.

Class 2 Class 2 have been working incredibly hard this week on their individual setting descriptions of The Chokey! There were excellent vocabulary choices and carefully thought out and effective sentence structures. In geography we learnt about ordnance survey map symbols and included them in our own maps of Mytholmroyd and in PE we started to learn some partner poses in yoga - it was tricky but we worked hard to get to grips with them! Finally, in science we applied our knowledge of living things to plants and showed that they fulfil all of the criteria.

Class 3 Class 3 have had a great week this week. In English we edited and published our non-chronological reports which have turned out brilliantly. In maths we calculated square and cube numbers. We also multiplied and divided numbers by 10, 100 and 1000. We even looked and numbers into the thousandths! In science we swabbed areas around the classroom to see which bacteria is growing there. We also conducted our yeast growing experiment where we changed one variable and then observed the rate of respiration of the yeast. In geography, we used maps and atlases to identify and locate the countries and capitals of North America. A super week everyone, well done!


