Class News

Class R This week we have been finding out about the life and work of Mary Anning. The children loved finding out about fossils and even got to make their own. Tennis coach Dan was very impressed with our listening, racket and ball skills on Wednesday. There are definitely some future tennis stars in Reception! We had a super trip to Manor Heath Park. We played in the adventure playground, explored the Jungle Experience and got to feed the fish and terrapins, looked at the beautiful plants in the walled garden and enjoyed finishing our visit with lollies and ice creams. On Friday transition morning we were super mathematicians and scientists!

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been working so hard in every lesson. They discussed what they thought toys in the future would be like and then became inventers and created their own. Not only that but they created a clear set of instructions on how to use their toy! In maths, Y1 have started their time unit-looking at telling the time to o'clock. The children did amazingly with this - I wonder if they can tell you the time at home (just focusing on o'clock for now) Y2 have been completing some assessments this week and have worked SO hard, I am extremely impressed. In science, Class 1 worked together to forecast the weather. They used weather symbols and presented to the class. Well done for great week!

Class 2 In English, we planned and wrote our diary entries. We had to plan a day in the life of a character and then think about what that character may say. A great effort by everyone! Well done! In maths, Year 3 have been collecting and presenting data. They are now confident creating pictograms and bar charts! Year 4 have been following and plotting co-ordinates. In science, we have learned about igneous, sedimentary and metamorphic rocks. We thought about how we could group different rocks and what features we could see in each. We also really enjoyed the tennis session that we had this week as well as performing the ukulele to everyone. A super week everyone, well done!

Class 3 This week Class 3 have been extra active! Alongside swimming and our usual PE lessons we manage to squeeze in some extra rounders and have a taster tennis session with Cragg Vale Tennis club. We've also edited and improved our balanced arguments and went over to a computer room in the high school to type up our final drafts! We've also been using our time in history to create our own history podcasts with an extra special episode on the Cragg Vale Coiners, bringing all of our learning and research together in audio form. In Spanish, we had a fashion show where we used our new vocabulary knowledge to describe the clothes on show. Finally, in art we have been completing our shadow puppet project. What a busy week - well done Class 3!

Next week the Friday lunch (pizza) will be served on Thursday instead for everyone who usually has it on Fridays.




