Class News

Class R In maths this week we have been exploring, copying, continuing and creating repeating patterns using natural objects, classroom items, voices, movement and dance. In topic we have been thinking about our sense of smell and taste. We used scientific language in a Zoom In, Zoom Out activity looking closely at a dog's nose. After watching a film of a snail looking for food, we used our noses to identify different smells. We also talked about good smells, bad smells and our favourite foods! In our Welly Wednesday session, we made some super potions.

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been learning all about Dianne Fossey and how she helped conservation in Africa! We discussed how she was similar to David Attenborough and talked about what we would like to help with to help the planet. In science we went on an everyday material observational walk and looked at a range of objects in the playground, discussed what materials they were made out of and their properties! The children have been working super hard with their phonics this week. Year 1 continue to learn new sounds and apply these to their writing and Year 2 have written a letter to the Fairy Queen expressing interest in a job with Father Christmas! Wow! Class 2 Class 2 have had a wonderful week this week! In English, we learned and performed a poetry piece. This really tested our reading fluency and our expression! We then created some wonderful descriptive sentences. These included capital letters, full stops, impressive language choices and joined handwriting! In maths, we have worked hard to solve problems using our addition skills. In PE, we continued practising our invasion skills and played some competitive games of dodgeball. We also enjoyed using the equipment to create some gymnastic sequences. In geography, we used our knowledge of longitude and latitude to split the map into different time zones. We then compared time in the UK to time in different countries.

Class 3 This week we have been busy writing the final drafts of our diary entries as a member of Ernest Shackleton's crew on the day that the voyage set sail. In science we have looked at physical changes and discussed a range of reversible and irreversible changes - there were some great discussions going on in this lesson with children having to justify and give reasons for their choices! Topic was a busy lesson this week as we built on our knowledge of courses of a river last week into features of a river this week! We have learnt about meanders, tributaries, sources and estuaries alongside lots of other things we could see along the way. We labelled the features on a diagram then were challenged to make our own river from salt dough and show the river features on there! Super!

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








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
