Class News

Class R This week Reception have had a super busy week! They were absolutely amazing in our Nativity play! They sang the songs and danced beautifully; I was extremely proud. Alongside this, they sat so wonderfully during the panto yesterday. They loved getting involved and dancing along to the songs. Reception have been very festive this week and have completed lots of Christmassy crafts such as cards, winter tree art (learning about deciduous and evergreen trees) and used a range of objects to make their pictures come to life! Well done, Reception!

Class 1 In maths we have been identifying, sorting and naming shapes as well as looking at lines of symmetry. In History we created a timeline of the events of The Great Fire of London. The children were able to recall many of the events and details and impressed Miss Moran with how much they have learned! Class 1 performed fabulously in our Nativity and they should all be very proud of themselves! Their behaviour was super on our trip to Huddersfield for the pantomime and we all enjoyed the show.

Class 2 This week Class 2 have been learning about reading co-ordinates from a grid during maths. We linked this to our map reading work from geography last half term. Everyone worked hard to remember to read the X axis first, then the Y axis. In Science, we looked at the life cycle of a flowering plants and were amazed at how many ways we came up with for how seeds could be dispersed to a new place once they were ready. During History we completed a research task around Stonehenge. We worked hard to come up with our historical enquiry questions and talked lots about how these were important for historians to consider before starting research, just like we did! Then we used chromebooks to research Stonehenge and answer the questions we chose. Finally, Class 2 have been fantastic during our Nativity performances and at the pantomime! They have really impressed Mrs Dean and I with how they have handled such a busy week! Well done, Class 2!

Class 3 Class 3 have had a great week this week! They performed confidently during our Nativity performance and then thoroughly enjoyed the pantomime. Well done to Year 6 for being great buddies to the Reception children. In maths we have revised our short division and even moved on to looking at remainders. We have also looked at strategies for answering two-mark questions during assessments. In English we have practiced our editing and publishing skills. In History we researched key events during World War 2 and then presented these on a timeline of our own design. A great week everyone, well done!
