Class News

Class R We have had a great start to the new term. We started the week by reading The Tiger Who Came to Tea and decided to write invitations to the tiger asking him to have tea with us in school. We talked about our favourite fruit and vegetables after reading Oliver's Vegetables and Oliver's Fruit Salad. We ended the week by reading Supertato, coming up with plans to stop The Evil Pea and making our own Super Veggies! In maths we have been finding and naming 3D shapes. We have also loved seeing the chicks!

Class 1 This week Class 1 have started their new geography unit-Paddington's Adventures. We discussed where Paddington has come from, Peru, and where he is wanting to go on his adventures- The United Kingdom! We also made a list of items that we believe he would take with him on his voyage and then came up with some amazing adjectives ready for our character description. In maths Y1/2 have been completing their measures unit. They have been measuring in non-standard units, cm and metres. We have even compared and ordered them too. Super learning, guys! In science we have been discussing chemicals and where we would find them!

Class 2 Class 2 have had a wonderful and very busy first week back after the Easter holidays! In maths, Year 4 have been developing their understanding of decimals and using tenths and hundredths accurately. Year 3 have been comparing capacity and solving a range of one step and two step problems. In English we have begun our new novel: The Borrowers by Mary Norton. We have started thinking about what we would borrow and what we would use in our house if we were a borrower. In science, we began our light unit and we are looking forward to conducting an experiment next week! In PE, we have started two new units of rounders and fitness circuits. We even did our first beep test to get our week 1 scores! A super week everyone, well done!

Class Class 3 have had a great first week back! We've started our new topic on rainforests and looked at the eco-systems that we would find there. We decided that they seem like very exciting places! In science we have been looking at chemical reactions and how we know that one has taken place. We investigated mixing different amounts of bicarbonate sodium with vinegar to produce carbon dioxide which we measured by capturing it in balloons. Showing that we had created the gas, as a new substance, helped us to see that a chemical reaction had happened! Finally, in English, we finished Rooftoppers! This week we have been writing alternative ending to the story and Miss Smith and Miss Gothard have been impressed by the variety of ideas of what a new ending for Sophie and Charles could be!

WhatsApp Concern

It has been brought to our attention that there are some WhatsApp groups circulating that are called things like 'add your contacts' or 'all around the world' and that children can get added to these groups by their contacts or may join them innocently. These groups have hundreds of members, are sharing unsuitable content and there have been reports in the media of pornographic images being shared on some of them too. The age for WhatsApp and social media is 13+ (WhatsApp having recently changed from 16) and it is advised that parents/carers follow this. If parents/carers have considered the risks of a child joining social media and are still happy to take those risks, then at the very least a parent/carer should become extremely pro-active around monitoring their child's mobile device and any use of social media, ensuring the deletion of any harmful content they find, and deleting any links to accounts, groups, or persons they do not know or have any concerns about. There have been some rumours that this initially began at Calder Primary School, this is not the case as can be seen by the news article above. However, we are aware that a few of our children have been added to some of these WhatsApp groups and so want to ensure this message gets out to all parents.

We would highly recommend that parents of younger pupils consider an approach like <u>this</u> if at all possible.
