### **Class News**

Class R What a busy week! On Monday we read Tell Me a Dragon by Jackie Morris. We talked about the different dragons in the story and the children then painted and described their own dragon - there were some fabulous ideas! We loved our visit to St Michael's Parish Church on Tuesday where we got to see (and touch) many of the things we have been learning about in RE this half term. On Wednesday, we took part in The Big Schools' Birdwatch and were fantastic at identifying the different birds that we saw. In Music we were super detectives - we listened to Cuckoo Polka by Johann Strauss II and identified the cuckoo sounds as well as listening to and identifying our friends' singing voices

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been map drawing during our geography lessons! We looked at our local area and created a map using a key and symbols! In science we learnt about different parts of the ear and how we support and help people with hearing impairments. Y2 have been fabulous during their English lessons this week, we have been on a toad fact hunt and started our non-chronological report writing. Y1 have been completing some amazing number bonds to 20, practical activities with partners and we even wrote the number sentences on the table! A great week everyone!

Class 2 Class 2 have created some wonderful sensory poems this week! The poems included personification, metaphors and similes which were all new terms to us! In maths, the Year 3's have been learning about measuring in cm, m and km and the Year 4's have been learning how to calculate perimeter. In science, we investigated conductors and insulators. We had to use our knowledge of circuits to decide whether a material would conduct the electricity. In geography, we researched facts about the four countries that make up the United Kingdom. We identified them on a map and recalled their flags, capital cities and patron saints! A great week everyone, well done!

Class 3. This week Class 3 have been busy researching a range of contrasting biomes that we find on our planet, ready for our class showcase next week! In maths, Year 6 have been getting to grips with ratio (and did a fantastic job!) while Year 5 have been multiplying multi-digit numbers together. In science, Class 3 have been investigating reflection and what properties make an object a better reflector than others. We then discussed where reflection comes into our daily lives such as mirrors on a car or sometimes on windows. We've also worked hard on completing our formal letters in English and developing our own street dance routines in PE!

The age guidance for WhatsApp is 13 however many pupils younger than this use this. It is advised that parents regularly check phones, supervise access, set boundaries and discuss these with them.

### **Parking and Collecting**

Unfortunately, we have had a few incidents recently at drop-off and home time – please can we ask that you follow the points below and also pass this on to anyone else who collects your children, for example grandparents or older siblings.

- Wherever possible, please walk, scoot or cycle onto site for drop-off and collection.
- Please only drive onto site from the Appleyard Road entrance.
- Please park in the car park or the drop off lanes and behind.
- If you have driven to the drop off lanes or behind, please then exit at the Brier Hey Lane end, rather than swinging the car around to leave from Appleyard Road again.
- If the drop off lane area is full, please drive through, out of Brier Hey Lane and park elsewhere.
- Please do not park next to the playground or on the bend, this makes it very difficult for buses that arrive late or for trips/fixtures and there have been accidents as a result of this in the past.
- The bus lane next to school is for afterschool club collection by The Ark.
- Please do not swear on our school site or grounds.
- Please do not allow dogs to foul on our grass areas and please keep dogs off the playgrounds. Please have them on leads.
- Please make sure staff can see you if you collecting – ideally wait on the playground but if you have a dog, please wait by the gate so they can see you.


