Class News

Class R We have had a great start to the new half term. In maths we have been exploring and comparing length and height. In phonics we have been doing some super reading and writing and have started to learn the Set 2 sounds. In topic we have been finding out about the moon and have created some wonderful artwork. We have also loved exploring our new roleplay area and dressing up as astronauts.

Class 1 This week Class 1 have started their new topic 'Historic Halifax'. To kick off our fantastic learning, we delved in to the history of Shibden Hall. We learnt about the 4 families that have lived at Shibden including the most well-known- The Lister Family. In RE we have started learning about 'How and why we celebrate'. We started our topic by discussing what we celebrate in life and then planning a birthday party for our class friend Stripes. In science we have been discussing different organisms' ears and how they adapt their hearing to help them survive. Well done Class 1!

Class 2 Class 2 have had a super week this week! In maths, we have started our fractions unit. Year 3 have been learning about numerators and denominators and how to add fractions to create a whole. Year 4 have been learning how to create and order mixed numbers. In English, we have started our new novel Varjak Paw by S.F. Said. We have thought carefully about the characters appearance, emotions and thoughts at the beginning of the story and we will track how these change throughout. In science, we started our sound unit. We investigated how sound is made and felt the vibrations of different sounds. We also enjoyed our new unit of basketball in P.E. We learned some different throws and had a go at shooting into the net. A great week everyone, well done!

Class 3. Class 3 have worked incredibly hard on their first week back! In science we investigated refraction but looking at objects through water and understanding how having to travel through a range of material changes the direction of the rays of light, affecting what we see. In PE we have started to develop netball skills and worked on receiving and defending centre passes, alongside some shooting practise. Year 6 have got to grips with algebra brilliantly in maths while Year 5 have been completing work on multiplication and division. Finally, in English we have been working hard to understand colons and how they are used. It was great to see Class 3 go on to use colons in their science and topic writing too! Well done, everyone!

Smartwatches with a camera function are not permitted, but Fitbit/step count digital ones are.

Children's Mental Health

It was great to have our mental health week megaphones displayed by TimeOut Calderdale in Halifax Central Library last week over half term and to hear that some of our families and staff had been to see them!

This week TimeOut came to deliver a workshop called 'Kindness, Friendship and Social Media' to both Class 3 and Class 2 (as they had time to work with both classes). They said the pupils engaged with the activities and conversations really well and were a pleasure to work with.

One area that came up was that children in both classes talked about playing and interacting online with people they don't know in real life (such as when playing computer games) and this led into a discussion with the children for example 'how do you know that it is really a 10-year-old girl you are playing with?' Some children found this a tricky concept to understand: that people wouldn't be telling the truth about who they are online.

This is something we will be following up by working with the children in school and we would recommend that parents have these conversations with their children regularly as well. There are some great resources to support parents with this on the NSPCC website here

Library Events

It is worth following Calderdale Libraries on Facebook to see when they advertise their library events for the Easter Holidays and beyond.

They always have some lovely events including Story Tots (Reception age and below), crafts, stories, lego, board games and often events aimed at ages 7-11 and 11+ too. Usually, they have a small cost for events – around £2 or sometimes free - and they need to be booked as they do sell out. They usually have multiple locations for these including Hebden Bridge, Sowerby Bridge and Halifax Central (next to The Piece Hall). Mrs Lambert took Stanley to the Supertato one in February half term and it was amazing!

Did you know that it is free to join Calderdale libraries and you can borrow books from any of their libraries? Children can borrow multiple books with no fines for late returns (there are fines if you lose a book though) and the library is a lovely place to discover new books and authors or find non-fiction books on topics they enjoy.







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
