Class News

Class R This week, Class R have been focused on the text 'The Giant Jam Sandwich'. They have sequenced the story, followed instructions and even endeavoured to write their own. Of course, we then had to follow our own instructions and make a yummy jam sandwich to enjoy! Alongside this, we have been learning about mass and capacity in our maths lessons. Reception have compared objects, discussing whether they are heavy or light and then they have filled different containers with different objects, seeing which container can hold the most. In in our sand area, we have been filling containers using different size spoons and seeing how many scoops it takes to fill! Well done, Reception.

Class 1 In maths, we began the week by adding using a number line. We moved on to adding and subtracting tens and noticed patterns in the number system that help us to do this. We have also been tackling adding 2 two-digit numbers. In geography, we have been thinking about cold weather, how the cold weather can affect our lives and how it might be dangerous for us. We have also continued tracking the daily weather conditions. In science we have been exploring the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive which led to some super ideas and discussions. Well done Class 1!

Class 2 This week we have started looking at food chains in science. We recapped how they are structured and discussed if plants or humans are more important within a food chain. In geography we looked at some features of volcanic eruptions and the effects that an eruption may have to the area around the volcano. We were surprised to see that there are some positives, such as tourists coming to the area which means they will spend money in local shops and cafes. During RE, we continued looking at Jewish celebrations and discussed Shabbat. Finally, in music with Mrs McVey this week, we developed our ukulele skills! Well done Class 2!

Class 3 Class 3 have had a great week this week. In maths we have been multiplying and dividing fractions and applying this new knowledge to reasoning and problem-solving questions. We have also been finding fractions of amounts and we have practiced solving 2-mark questions which include this. In English we have practiced correctly punctuating dialogue and then applied this when creating a conversation between Bradley and his mum. In geography we investigated what products are important into the UK and also what the UK exports to other countries. In science we recapped the circulatory system and then investigated how long our heart rate takes to return back to normal after intense exercise. A super week everyone!
