Class News

Class R

It was World Bee Day this week. We found out why bees are so important, watched some busy bee hives and made our own bees. We found a tiny door behind the bin in the classroom! We knocked but nobody answered and the children had many ideas about what could be behind the door. The children made keys to try to open it and posters to see if anybody knew anything about it! We found the countries on the map and enjoyed watching a Mariachi band, a bald eagle, Niagara Falls and even tried to do our own Riverdance. Class 1

This week Class 1 have been working super hard in every lesson. In Maths- Y2 have continued their learning of fractions and have been amazing! Y1 have just started their fractions unit and have been focusing on halves this week, finding and recognising them. – super. In English, we have been completing some whole class writing linking to our topic 'Paddington's Adventures'. Over the past half term children have completed a character description, post card, diary entry and written a set of instructions. In science we have been learning all about forces and this week we have been measuring force with newton meters! Well done Class 1! 😊

Class 2

Class 2 have had a super week this week! We really enjoyed watching the performances by Calder High - it really inspired us with our own musical performances that we have coming up. In maths, we have been telling the time using analogue, 12-hour and 24-hour clocks. We can now convert between 12-hour clocks and 24-hour clocks. In English, we have been creating cinquain poetry. We had to think carefully about the adjectives and verbs we chose to create the best poem. In PE, we enjoyed the good weather and had a whole class game of rounders. It was a very good game and a very close match! A great week everyone, well done!

Class 3

This week Class 3 have been busy in English investigating house listings, ready to write our own. The theme of moving house is a key part of our new class book, 'Skellig'. Year 5 have started their geometry unit in maths with Mrs Kennedy, while Year 6 have been learning how to draw pie charts and input data into them with Miss Smith. In topic we looked at how tropical rainforests have global significance. We discussed the main ways in which they contribute to our planet and what life could be like without them! During science, we clarified our understanding on gears, levers and pulleys and came up with lots of great examples of where we can find them in everyday life - great job, Class 3!

Lost items


