Class News

Class R We have had another exciting week in Reception. The Gingerbread Man ran away from our classroom on Monday. We hunted for him all around school and asked everyone that we saw, but nobody had seen him. On Thursday we finally found out that he had run all the way to London! His postcard told us he had visited all the sights (and luckily, he didn't mention having seen any runaway horses!). In maths we have been working on our knowledge and understanding of numbers to 20. In RE we have been thinking about what makes a good friend.

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been learning all about continents and where Peru is located on the world map. We used atlases to label all the continents, highlighting South America and then sticking Paddington in Peru! In maths, Y1 have been super mathematicians and have completed some amazing measuring and comparing of capacity and volume. Y2 have also completed this and started measuring in millilitres. Class 1 thoroughly enjoyed their trip to Shibden Hall- we recapped prior learning of our last topic 'Historic Halifax' and explored the magnificent, historic hall. We even spotted the family coat of arms that we studied. Of course, we then had to have a play in the park - what a fabulous day!

Class 2 Class 2 have had a very productive week this week! We have written a great informative piece of writing based around how to ensure the safety of the borrowers. Everyone has used headings, sub-headings, bullet points and created paragraphs! I am so impressed everyone - well done! In maths, the Year 3s have been finding unit and non-unit fractions of amounts. The Year 4s have been comparing, ordering and rounding decimals, using their knowledge of tenths and ones. In science, we learned how mirrors reflect light and how they reverse the images. We also discovered what happens when the light reflects off a surface that isn't flat. In music, the Year 3s continued their ukulele sessions - they are getting great at reading the chords! The Year 4s started their music lessons which will focus on music composition. In PE, we continued with our rounders unit and we have even started learning how to get each other out during a game. A great week everyone - well done!

Class 3 This week Class 3 have been busy in English doing some story writing! We have worked hard this week to complete our first drafts, ready to edit and publish next week. In topic we have learned about the different layers of the tropical rainforest and which animals live in each different layer and why. We've enjoyed singing our layers of the rainforest song too! In science we have also started looking at forces! This week we were busy revising all that we knew about forces already and next week we're hoping to plan an investigation into gravitational pull!

Some help please

There are a couple of things which have come up this week in school that we have spoken to the children about but would also appreciate your support from home with as well:

- Please can we ask that children do not bring in items from home such as toys, fidgets and teddies (unless arranged with staff for a specific need). Pupils are able to bring a pencil case with a small amount of stationery if they wish to and a water bottle (containing water) each day.
