Class News

Class R We have been reading The Lighthouse Keeper's Lunch this week. We came up with our own plans to stop the seagulls and created menus of yukky food for them. In maths we have been looking at maps and using positional language. We looked on google maps and managed to find some of our houses by describing where they are. We enjoyed our first sports day at Calder Primary. The children tried their best and were super in each event. Well done, Reception!

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been working hard on describing the seasons and how the weather changes in each one. We also looked at how many sunlight hours we have and answered some scientific questions about each season. In maths, Y1 have been recognising coins and notes and Y2 have been looking at tally charts, tables and block diagrams. They have been looking at the data given and answering questions and finding the difference. In DT we have continued making our vehicles, making sure our wheels and axels are correct and then decorating them. Y2 have been working hard in their English lessons, making sure to use chronological order, time adverbials and contractions when writing about their weekends with Flat Stanley. A busy week!

Class 2 Class 2 have had an amazing week! On Monday, we loved having sports day and were very impressed with the competitive spirit and sportsmanship shown by all. In English, we have continued reading The Land of Roar and are very intrigued to find out how Arthur is going to save his Grandad. We have practised punctuating direct speech and are applying this to the narrative that we are planning. In maths, Year 3 have been identifying 3D shapes and constructing their nets. Year 4 have started their statistics unit and have been interpreting bar charts and pictograms. In science, we researched planets in our solar system and created a poster to show this information. In history, we have compared what life was like during the Maya period. A great week
