## **Class News**

Class R We had a great time on our cloth hunt around The Piece Hall this week! We found out about the process of turning fleece to yarn and got to have a go at each part of the process including washing, carding and spinning, before weaving our own piece of material to take home. Our focus in maths this week were the numbers 9 and 10. We have found 9 and 10 in the outdoor learning area, sorted dominoes into groups - less than 10 spots, 10 spots and more than 10 spots and represented 9 and 10 using ten frames, beads on string, numicon, cubes and clocks. In topic we have been finding out about stars and constellations. We created our own constellations and wrote about them too!

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been learning all about Dean Clough and why it was significant in the past. In Forest school we have been using our senses and exploring and observing the natural environment, we even used natural resources to make music! Y2 have been working super hard on their character descriptions and have even turned their work into missing posters for 'The Lonely Beast'. In science we have been learning about how eyes work and how we see. Amazing work, Class 1 😉

Class 2 Class 2 have had a very busy week this week! In maths both Year 3 and Year 4 have started discovering equivalent fractions. They can all use a fraction wall and find equivalent fractions from a number line. In English, we have started planning our non-fiction text and researched all the information we need to include. In history, we have learned the names of many Greek Gods and Goddesses and then decided what we would like to be the God/Goddess of. In science, we explored how the volume of sound is affected by the distance that it has to travel. We all enjoyed a wonderful World Book Day. We had a very competitive quiz and book scavenger hunt! A great week everyone, well done!

Class 3 Another brilliant and busy week for Class 3! We've been working hard in PE on delivering strong passes in netball and getting to grips with the footwork rules. In English we've been finding synonyms and antonyms and made loads of progress with reading Rooftoppers: we're hooked! During RE, we looked at how Sikhs show respect to the Guru Granth Sahib and looked at the daily prayer that is said before and after reading from it. Finally, we had a wonderful World Book Day! Lots of fantastic character and book choices were seen, and we enjoyed a little teaser of our new class book for after the holidays, read to us by Mr Guise!
