Class News

Class R This week we have been developing our fine motor skills with lots of art and craft projects. We have threaded pony beads to make candy canes, decorated wooden baubles, made paper snowflakes, created Christmas wreaths and found out about the four seasons whilst making calendars. We have looked at photographs of Christmas in the past and discussed what we could see in the photographs, what looked the same as now, what looked different and why, in one photograph, we could see a family sitting around a radio. In PE, we finished our dance based on the poem 'Twas The Night Before Christmas'. We have also been working hard to complete our Rainbow Challenges.

Class 1 This week Class 1 have been working super hard with all their end of term assessments. Alongside this, we have been sorting 2D shapes and then created our own Christmas images using only shapes! In science we have been learning how to construct a simple circuit and we even learnt the symbols and matched them to the correct part. Well done! In Forest School we have been looking at a range of different trees and identifying if they are deciduous or evergreen. Alongside this, in art we have been looking at Picasso's blue period and identifying feelings/emotions with colour. We created our own portraits of sad and happy people and used a range of different colours that portray different emotions.

Class 2 What a busy week we have had this week! In maths, Year 3 have been consolidating their multiplication skills so they are ready to start division after Christmas and Year 4 have been finding related multiplication and division facts. In English, we have edited and redrafted our diary entry based on 'Marcy and the Riddle of the Sphinx'. We even wrote them on tea-stained paper for an Ancient Egypt effect! In history we have learned all about Ancient Egyptian Gods and why they were so important. We also really enjoyed our Reindeer Run!

Class 3 Class 3 have worked hard this week in English and topic to research Lindisfarne and create a fact file about it. They had some great historical enquiry questions the begin their research and worked hard to find the most reliable information to include within their writing. In PE, we continued with athletics and this week practised some field events. Mrs McVey taught us how to play 'Jingle bells' on the glockenspiels this week in music - she was very impressed on how quickly Class 3 picked it up and were ready to perform!

Super Scientists

This week Class 2 had a very special science lesson up at Calder High. A few weeks ago, when they conducted their boiling experiments, the children gained an interest in Bunsen burners and how they are used. This week they had the opportunity to learn how to assemble and safely use a Bunsen burner! They could all explain the difference between a safety flame and a roaring flame. They then had the chance to use a Bunsen burner to create coloured flames. They had splints dipped in different metals that changed the colour of the Bunsen flame. It was fascinating! They then created a sparkler using iron filings. A great science lesson and everyone behaved so sensibly around the flames. Great work Class 2!

Reception Request


Reception class would like to ask if anyone has any old items below that they no longer need, they would be grateful for their outdoor kitchen area!


- pots, pans, trays, kitchen utensils (large serving spoons and ladles would be very useful)

- They are also hoping for a couple of wooden pallets if anyone knows a source!

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
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Have your say about the future of your cinema
