Class News

Class R

This week we all found out what part we will play in the Nativity and we have been working hard to learn our songs. We have been exploring 4 and 5 in maths. In topic we wrote wanted posters for Lanky Len and Hefty Hugh. We have also been exploring maps. We discussed the map in What the Ladybird Heard, found school on a map and mapped out Rosie's Walk.

Class 1

This week Class 1 have been busy practicing for their Nativity! Alongside this, we have been learning about life during King James I reign -we even compared it to life today! In art we have started our portraits unit and began our learning by looking at famous portraits such as the Mona Lisa! We used mirrors and sketching techniques to create our own self portrait. What a great week we have had in Class 2! In English, we have finished our non-fiction writing about Isatau Ceesay. All of the information texts are bright, informative and clear. Well done everyone! In maths, we have been working on our multiplication skills. The Year 3's have focused on their 2,4 and 8times tables whereas the Year 4's have focused on their 3,6 and 9 times tables. There have also been some very competitive games on TTRS! In science, we all enjoyed going to the high school and using the labs! We boiled different liquids and measured the rate they boiled and the temperature they reached. In history, we are continuing to look at the timeline of Ancient Egypt and exploring what life would have been like at the time. A great week everyone!

Class 3

Class 3 have worked hard in topic this week by working in teams to script, produce and perform a news report on the Scots invading Britain. There were some excellent and very well thought out performances from much of the class - Miss Gothard and I were impressed! In English, we have been writing the final draft of our setting descriptions, which have some amazing vocabulary in them and describe the Antarctic setting that Shackleton was in extremely well. We have used comic strips in RE to help us learn the story of Rama and Sita for Diwali this year and why Hindus celebrate it. Finally, in outdoor learning this week, we visited different parts of the local area to create wordscapes. Great job, Class 3!

It was a muddy one at the Cross Country this week – well done to our runners!







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
